K/PP

This term in K/PP we have been talking all things dinosaurs! There is so much information to learn about dinosaurs and we are having the best time investigating all there is to know. We have grown our very own dinosaur right here in the classroom and at the moment we are waiting for our swimming reptiles to hatch!

This week we started looking at how we know so much about dinosaurs if people were never on earth to see them. That got us talking about fossils! Through our learning journey we discovered that the scientists who study fossils are called palaeontologists. Palaeontologists have found and studied fossils all over the world - even in Antarctica! We thought we might like to have a go at being palaeontologists on Tuesday, so we got our pickaxes, brushes, magnifying glasses and sieves, and we went up to the bush to see if we could find any fossils in the sedimentary rock.

We came back with quite a few rocks and will continue to see what we can discover from them! We are always busy learning down here in K/PP so stay tuned to see

Technologies

This term in Technologies, we have been developing our coding systems and algorithm writing skills by applying them to simulated activities and applications. Students have been introduced to the "Hour of Code" model used by schools across Australia. The hour of code tutors students through a sequence of activities with increasing difficulty. If parents are interested in trying Hour of Code it is available for free at https://code.org/minecraft - but be warned, it can be quite addictive!

Pre-Primary to Year 4 students have been practising the sequence of coding using the free application, Scratch Jr. Students have made short cartoon sequences using up to four frames and their own voices for added humour. This application is available free and can be downloaded to iPads and devices. Year 5/6 students have been challenged by 8-bit ACSII Codes and Binary numbers. This is the language used for information exchange across computers and devices. The ASCII coding system is the English equivalent of human language. There are hundreds of computer and programming languages which are used in computer information interchange, storage and writing programs. It is very intriguing to be teaching content that we, as parents and teachers, were never taught at school!
