Dear Parents and Friends,

Thank you for the lovely, warm welcome back to St Bernard's after my Long Service Leave in Term 3. I had a wonderful break, but I am very happy to be back and looking forward to Term 4. Mrs Scanlon has also asked me to pass on her thanks for the lovely St Bernard's welcome while she was Principal in Term 3.

Last Friday, Mrs Matthews, Mrs Sumner and I had the pleasure of attending the CEWA Quality Catholic Education Awards at the Hyatt Ballroom in Perth. St Bernard's was a finalist in the Stewardship category for its Bush School and Jnr. Stars Kindy initiative and we were thrilled to be announced the winners! With 79 schools entering the awards this year, this was no mean feat, and our school was one of only two country schools featuring in the awards and the smallest by far. Well done, St Bernard's!

I wasn't sure if an acceptance speech would be needed, but I had one prepared and would like to share some parts of it with you – it acknowledges some people who were very important to our win!

The idea for Bush School came about as a practical way to get our Pre Primary students out of their room so that we could begin our 3 year old program, in a bid to introduce more families to our school and what it has to offer, hopefully leading to more enrolments. I would like to thank three groups of people for turning that idea into such a successful venture.

Firstly, the amazing Early Childhood teaching team at St Bernard's, and especially our Bush School teacher, Mrs Sue Sumner, and our 3 year old Kindy teacher, Mrs Melissa Matthews. These two wonderful Early Childhood educators bring such expertise, skill and passion to their roles and I am constantly in awe of how they apply the craft of teaching to mould and shape the learning of the young lives they lead.

Secondly, our incredibly supportive school community which took the slightly crazy idea of a Bush School to their heart and gave it their full and enthusiastic backing. While it may not have been such a big leap for our farming families, to see it embraced by our CALD and townie families has been wonderful.

And finally, our Bush School students whose love for learning in the bush inspires us every day. There is nothing better than to head out to Bush School and see our students using their critical and creative thinking skills to problem solve and push the boundaries of their knowledge and understanding in God's amazing outdoor classroom. And, of course, their capacity to find dirt and mud - and to cover themselves in it - is a constant source of wonder and joy.

Finally, I'm pleased to let you know that, as of next week, our 3 year old enrolments sit at 22, and also our new initiative of Bush School Pre Kindy on Friday mornings begins with 16 enrolments.

Term 4 has started at a cracking pace with Dancesport, Book Fair, the Kojonup Show and the Year 3/4 camp already happening. Next Thursday we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation with our Year 3 students – please keep our candidates Essie Bell and Elsie Eyres and their families in your thoughts and prayers. Finally, a reminder that our school and parish will host the annual Rosary Rally on Sunday starting at 9am with Mass and Benediction, followed by morning tea at the school and the Rosary Rally in front of the grotto. 
