Library





I was thrilled to start Term 2 as St Bernard's Library teacher and even more thrilled to see so many new books which had been put on display disappear in the first week. Always a good sign! As well as having the opportunity to change their library books, students have also been playing a few library games and taking part in library scavenger hunts. The focus this term for students in Years 1-6 has been on selecting a suitable prose text for Oral Language presentations next week. Students have considered texts which are of interest to them, at their reading level, include an exciting part of the story and may have dialogue, all of which helps to engage the audience. We have broken down how to read fluently into several topics. Expression is important, along with clarity, volume, giving voice to characters, using punctuation markers, understanding how the characters are feeling and modifying the speed you read at according to what you are reading. Practice makes perfect! Meanwhile, the Pre-primary group listen to a story during their library time and complete an activity.

On Wednesday morning the whole school took part in National Simultaneous Storytime, reading the same book at the same time as other students all around Australia. This year's book was The Speedy Sloth by Rebecca Young. Students loved hearing the story of Spike the sloth who wanted to compete in a race and did herself and the other sloths proud ... even though she came last! Afterwards, we went onto the basketball court and completed a very short race in which everyone had to keep moving but the winner was the person who managed to come last. Quite a challenge for lots of people! Happy reading!
