Dear Parent and Carers,

It has been a wonderful two weeks at St Bernard's! I hope you enjoy catching up with the news about what has been going on in this newsletter.

#### **EDUCATION**

#### Reading:

In the past couple of weeks the staff's focus has been on reading at St Bernard's and, in particular, how we can support and promote home and classroom reading in order to enable all our students to achieve success in this critically important foundational learning skill. We are currently in the middle of a Teaching Sprint to enable our staff to track progress of student home and classroom reading. The sprint will involve trialling several new processes and strategies, including the home reading package for children aged 5 - 13 years which was sent to all families last week. The package included our Home Reading Charter, an agreement form to be signed by parents and students and a home reading tips sheet. A similar package is being prepared for our Kindy students which will be relevant to all children aged 0-5 years. Please return your signed Home Reading Charter Agreement slip and look out for more information about reading in the coming weeks.

## **GS Network STEM meeting:**

St Bernard's hosted the GS Network Years 3 and 4 STEM meeting last week. Miss Hewitt attended the meeting with me and shared Power Point presentations created by the students to support the work this group is doing in moderating. The students had done an excellent job of forming an inquiry question and completing research to begin answering their question and are excited to get going on the planning and creating phase of their STEM projects for this year.

**Oral Language Week:** Congratulations to all our students for a fantastic effort with their prose readings for Oral Language Week. I was so impressed with how confident and proficient all our readers were. Well done, everyone!

Outdoor Classroom Day: Our first whole school Outdoor Classroom day for this year went ahead on a cold and wet Tuesday this week with everyone having a fantastic time despite the weather. We started the day with a parade as so many students had dressed up in our pioneer theme – prizes for best dressed were handed out at assembly today.
