STEM

St Bernard's Year 3/4 class attended the Great Southern Network STEM Showcase at St Patrick's in Katanning. Also attending were Year 3 and 4 students from St Matthews in Narrogin, St Joseph's in Albany and St Patrick's. Throughout the day students from each school spent time taking turns presenting their group's project and looking at all the other projects on display.

CEWA judges chose the winners in four categories: Inspired by Nature, Wellbeing, Integration of Technology and Social Entrepreuneurship. St Bernard's had a couple of winners on the day, including Daisy Wellstead who had a winning entry in the Wellbeing category with her 'Helping Hand Robot'. Daisy's robot is designed to provide homeless people with items they need including blankets, first aid, clothing, food and water.

We also had a winning group in the three overall winners chosen on the day, which will enter the online National STEM MAD competition, competing against Catholic primary schools across Australia and against year levels up to Year 6. Our winning group comprised Archie Millar, Chevin Noonan, Archie Thorn and Patrick Wellstead with their project 'Steve the Coral Cooling Swordfish'. This project is a coral cooling device that injects frozen water into coral to stop bleaching from occurring. This group will now begin creating their STEM MAD video submission which will be sent off to STEM MAD, with the online results of this competition being announced on November 1st.



The other projects from the class include:

The Micro-Limiter: a device stopping microplastic in waterways (Elsie Eyres, Evie Millar, Georgie Matthews and Vita Macri).

Eli the Electric Boat: rubbish collection device for oceans (Tapi Henderson, Jake Perry, Spencer Grace and Charlie Miotti).

The Rubbish Drone: a drone collecting rubbish on land (Gurarpan Singh Chahal, George Garcia and Leeam Viloria). The Underground Farm: Aims to decrease deforestation by farming underground (Alec Treeby and Scott Bilney). Walter the Water Filter Robot: A device that filters dirty water for places around the world that don't have access to clean water (Hannah Jiril and Merliah Gementiza).



Each group has worked extremely hard on these projects over the last three terms and should be extremely proud of what they have achieved and the way they presented their projects last week. Stay tuned next term for the STEM MAD results and a school showcase for students and parents to attend.
