St Bernard's Primary School is seeking a dynamic and enthusiastic teacher, with a proven play-based, inquiry learning focus, to join our dedicated teaching staff in 2023. This is an opportunity to join a school where the focus is on working with every student to reach their highest potential in all aspects of their development. St. Bernard's has 98 students from 3-year-old Kindy through to Year 6. Classes are small and composite: Kindy/Pre-Primary, Year 1/2, Year 3/4 and Year 5/6. This is an ongoing position. The teacher and Curriculum Coordinator roles can be separated, but we are hoping to find one teacher to fill both roles.

St Bernard's is a co-educational primary school located in Kojonup, which is approximately 255km south of Perth and 150km north of Albany on Albany Highway. Kojonup is a vibrant, rural community offering excellent sporting and community services and facilities.

St Bernard's is a friendly, supportive and community-focused school. There is active parental support and excellent collegiality amongst staff.

Japanese, Art, Science, Physical Education and Technologies are specialist curriculum areas. The school has a strong focus on the effective instruction of Literacy and Numeracy and teachers work with the Literacy and Numeracy Dedicated Time models, actively collecting and using data to inform planning and instruction for all students. Our school is well resourced and seeks to effectively integrate learning technologies into all classrooms. We have a strong play-based, inquiry focused approach in the Early Years and our Year 1/2 students spend half a day in Bush School on site each week.

- Have a strong understanding of the English and Mathematics learning areas in the Western Australian Curriculum
- Demonstrate excellent classroom management and organisational skills in order to create a supportive and safe environment for all students
- The ability to differentiate teaching and learning programs to cater for a variety of student needs, including students from a CALD background
- The ability to collect, analyse and engage with student data to inform teaching and learning - with a particular focus on the areas of Literacy and Numeracy
- The capacity and enthusiasm to build positive and constructive relationships with students, colleagues, parents and the wider community

**Qualification/s Required:**

- Relevant 4 year tertiary qualification in Early Childhood Education
- Accreditation to Teach Religious Education Learning Area, or the ability to achieve Accreditation to Teach Religious Education, is highly desirable
